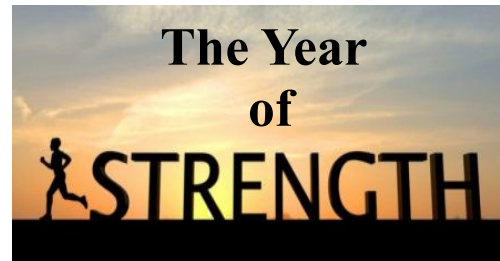

HOW TO ACCEPT JESUS CHRIST INTO YOUR HEART

Perhaps while reading the announcements you realized you have never made a Christian commitment. Don't delay that decision! We encourage you to embrace God's love today and receive the salvation that only Jesus Christ gives. Here are five simple steps you can take to find assurance of salvation.

1. **Recognize your need.** The Bible tell us that "all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God." (Rom. 3:23) All of us are sinners, and we must admit our need for a Savior.
2. **Repent of your sins.** Our sins create a wall that separates us from God. By confessing our sins and turning from them, you will find forgiveness. The Bible promises: "If we confess our sins, He is faithful and righteous to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness" (1 John 1:9).
3. **Believe in Jesus.** God sent His only Son to die so that He could pay for all our sins. Put your faith in Him and believe in His power to save you. The Bible says, "For God so loved the world, that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him shall not perish, but have eternal life" (John 3:16).
4. **Receive His salvation.** God has given us a great gift in His Son, but we must receive His gift. Thank Him for loving and forgiving you, and ask Him to live in your heart. His promise to us is clear: "But as many as received Him, to them He gave the right to become children of God" (John 1:12).
5. **Confess your faith.** The Bible assures us: "If you confess with your mouth, 'Jesus is Lord,' and believe in your heart that God raised Him from the dead, you will be saved" (Rom. 10:9). You have been born again and are now part of God's family. Tell some one else what Jesus has done in your life!

Heavenly Father, I now understand my need to have my sins forgiven. I also realize that only Jesus — because of His sacrifice on the cross — can forgive my sin. I put my faith and trust in Jesus today. Please forgive me and become the Lord of my life.

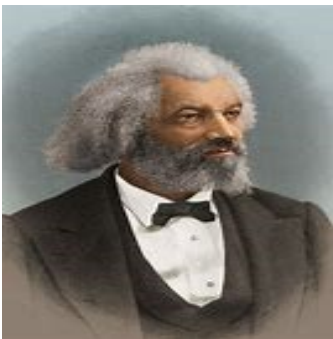
The History of Black History Month

Americans have recognized black history annually since 1926, first as "Negro History Week" and later as "Black History Month." What you might not know is that black history had barely begun to be studied-or even documented-when the tradition originated. Although blacks have been in America at least as far back as colonial times, it was not until the 20th century that they gained a respectable presence in the history books.

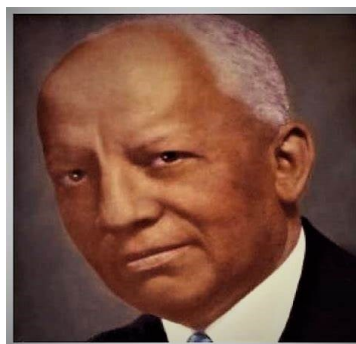
We owe the celebration of Black History Month, and more importantly, the study of black history, to Dr. Carter G. Woodson. Born to parents who were former slaves, he spent his childhood working in the Kentucky coal mines and enrolled in high school at age twenty. He graduated within two years and later went on to earn a Ph.D. from Harvard. The scholar was disturbed to find in his studies that history books largely ignored the black American population-and when blacks did figure into the picture, it was generally in ways that reflected the inferior social position they were assigned at the time.

Woodson, always one to act on his ambitions, decided to take on the challenge of writing black Americans into the nation's history. He established the Association for the Study of Negro Life and History (now called the Association for the Study of Afro-American Life and History) in 1915, and a year later founded the widely respected Journal of Negro History. In 1926, he launched Negro History Week as an initiative to bring national attention to the contributions of black people throughout American history.

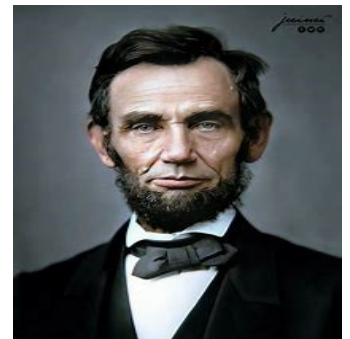
Woodson chose the second week of February for Negro History Week because it marks the birthdays of two men who greatly influenced the black American population Frederick Douglass and Abraham Lincoln.

Special Election for Congressional District 4

The Special Election Date is February 21, 2023. The polls open at 6:00am and close at 7:00pm. The Special Election is being held due to the death of Congressman A. Donald McEachin who represented the 4th Congressional District. This Election is only for voters within Congressional District 4.

The deadline to register to vote, or update an existing registration for this Election is **February 14, 2023.**

EARLY VOTING

Early Voting began on **Friday, January 6, 2023.** You may visit your Voter Registration Office and vote in person during normal business hours. Henrico County business hours are 8:00am to 4:30pm, Monday through Friday. There are also two Saturday dates available for in person voting at your Voter Registration Office. The Saturday dates are **February 11, 2023** and **February 18, 2023.** The Saturday hours are 9:00am to 5:00pm.

Last day to vote early at local Voter Registration Office – **Saturday, February 18, 2023.**
After **February 18, 2023,** you will have to go to your polling location on Election Day.

You may contact Henrico County Voter Registration Office at (804) 501-4347.

Voters who reside outside of Henrico County are encouraged to check with their locality regarding their business hours.

VOTE BY MAIL

Deadline to submit an application for a ballot to be mailed to you – **Friday, February 10, 2023.**
Request must be received by Voter Registration Office by 5:00pm. This is the last day that an application to vote by mail will be accepted.

For voters that indicated “Yes” to the question on the Virginia Absentee Ballot Application Form “Do you want to vote by mail for all **future elections**”, there will be no need to submit another application. If you are unsure of your status, you are encouraged to contact your locality’s Voter Registration Office.

Keep in mind when voting by mail you must allow time for the ballot to be mailed to you and for you to return the ballot by mail.

Voters who will be voting by mail are strongly encouraged to request and submit your application as soon as possible.

Please be aware that all voter registration offices have drop off boxes for voters who desire to return their **completed ballots** in person as oppose to mailing via the post office.

Remember every vote counts!

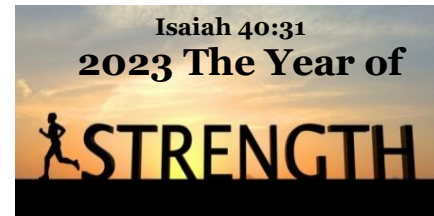
