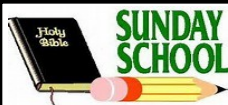

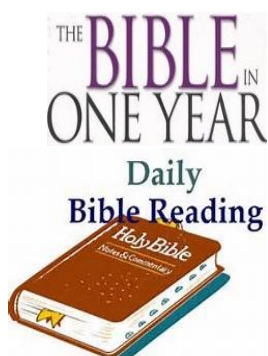

HOW TO ACCEPT JESUS CHRIST INTO YOUR HEART

Perhaps while reading the announcements you realized you have never made a Christian commitment. Don't delay that decision! We encourage you to embrace God's love today and receive the salvation that only Jesus Christ gives. Here are five simple steps you can take to find assurance of salvation.

1. **Recognize your need.** The Bible tell us that "all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God." (Rom. 3:23) All of us are sinners, and we must admit our need for a Savior.
2. **Repent of your sins.** Our sins create a wall that separates us from God. By confessing our sins and turning from them, you will find forgiveness. The Bible promises: "If we confess our sins, He is faithful and righteous to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness" (1 John 1:9).
3. **Believe in Jesus.** God sent His only Son to die so that He could pay for all our sins. Put your faith in Him and believe in His power to save you. The Bible says, "For God so loved the world, that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him shall not perish, but have eternal life" (John 3:16).
4. **Receive His salvation.** God has given us a great gift in His Son, but we must receive His gift. Thank Him for loving and forgiving you, and ask Him to live in your heart. His promise to us is clear: "But as many as received Him, to them He gave the right to become children of God" (John 1:12).
5. **Confess your faith.** The Bible assures us: "If you confess with your mouth, 'Jesus is Lord,' and believe in your heart that God raised Him from the dead, you will be saved" (Rom. 10:9). You have been born again and are now part of God's family. Tell some one else what Jesus has done in your life!

What Is Domestic Violence

Domestic violence is a pattern of behaviors used by one partner to maintain power and control over another partner in an intimate relationship. It is a serious problem that affects many families and does not only refer to physical violence, but also can include things like threats, unwanted contact, insults, forced sex, isolation, financial control, emotional, and/or verbal abuse.

Domestic, or intimate partner, violence can affect every part of a person's life. Between 21-60% of domestic violence, survivors lose their jobs due to reasons stemming from the abuse. These survivors lose a total of 8 million days of paid work each year collectively. This issue also has a negative effect on our society as a whole – the cost of domestic violence exceeds \$8.3 billion annually.

While not all of us have been exposed to domestic violence personally, data from the National Intimate Partner and Sexual Violence Survey shows that on average, "20 people per minute are victims of physical violence by an intimate partner in the US." Estimates suggest that domestic violence from an intimate partner affects all genders. 1 in 4 women and 1 in 8 men in Virginia will experience domestic violence in their lifetime.

In many domestic violence cases, children have been impacted as well as adults. Up to 10 million children and youth witness domestic violence in their homes each year. This exposure can have a long-lasting impact. Children who are exposed may become fearful and anxious. They are often on guard, never knowing what may trigger the abuse to occur, and therefore never feel safe. Children in these situations often feel worthless and powerless.

One big problem faced by those working to end domestic violence is the fact that people know that it's common, but often don't know what to do if they suspect someone, they know is a victim of domestic violence. For ways to support a friend or loved one, [click here](#).

What is Breast Cancer?

Breast Cancer is a disease in which malignant (cancer) cells form in the tissues of the breast.

Did You Know These Facts About Breast Cancer?

- 1 in 8 women in the US will be diagnosed with breast cancer in her lifetime.
- Breast cancer is the most commonly diagnosed cancer in women.
- Breast cancer is the second leading cause of cancer death among women.
- Although breast cancer in men is rare, an estimated 2,470 men will be diagnosed with breast cancer and approximately 460 will die each year
- Over 3.3 million breast cancer survivors are alive in the United States today

Signs/Symptoms

- Lump in the breast
- Breast/nipple tenderness
- Thickening of an area of the breast or around the nipple
- Dimpling anywhere of the breast
- Nipple discharge
- Asymmetry of the breast
- Inverted nipple

Diagnosis

Breast cancer can be diagnosed through multiple tests, including a mammogram, ultrasound, MRI, and biopsy.

Prevention

When breast cancer is detected early and is in the localized stage, the five-year survival rate is 100%. Early detection includes doing monthly breast self-exams, scheduling regular clinical breast exams, and mammograms.

Awareness of the symptoms and the need for screening are important ways of reducing the risk. Many breast lumps are not cancerous, but any woman who is concerned about a lump or change of their breasts, should see a doctor.
