The color for Epiphany is **GREEN**. The color **GREEN** stands for life and growth. The color of the table cloth on the Communion table and podium are changed to **GREEN** to indicate the season. The "pulpit dress" is changed according to the season of the Christian Calendar.



Theme For This Quarter:

"JUSTICE, LAW, HISTORY"

The study this quarter focuses on justice as presented in a variety of Old Testament Scriptures. Justice originates in the nature of God and is given to God's people as a gift under the Law. The history of God's covenant people shows that kings who exercised God's justice according to God's Law were considered good kings.

UNIT 3* "JUSTICE and ADVERSITY"

This unit has five lessons that deals with situations in which justice seems absent. In 2 Samuels, Nathan condemns David for his acts of injustice toward Uriah the Hittite, Bathsheba's husband. In Ezra, after years of exile in Babylon, Ezra returns to Jerusalem and determines to restore respect for God's Law. Lesson 3 tells the story of Job's faithfulness to God after several tragic events in his life. The Scriptures in Job question the presence of God's justice when Job has suffered greatly.

People tend to rationalize why bad things happen. How do people respond when they are faced with tragedy—natural disasters, birth defects, atrocious crimes, etc.? HOW TO ACCEPT JESUS CHRIST INTO YOUR HEART

Perhaps while reading the announcements you realized you have never made a Christian commitment. Don't delay that decision! We encourage you to embrace God's love today and receive the salvation that only Jesus Christ gives. Here are five simple steps you can take to find assurance of salvation.

1. **Recognize your need.** The Bible tell us that "all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God." (Rom. 3:23) All of us are sinners, and we must admit our need for a Savior.
2. **Repent of your sins.** Our sins create a wall that separates us from God. By confessing our sins and turning from them, you will find forgiveness. The Bible promises: "If we confess our sins, He is faithful and righteous to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness" (1 John 1:9).
3. **Believe in Jesus.** God sent His only Son to die so that He could pay for all our sins. Put your faith in Him and believe in His power to save you. The Bible says, "For God so loved the world, that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him shall not perish, but have eternal life" (John 3:16).
4. **Receive His salvation.** God has given us a great gift in His Son, but we must receive His gift. Thank Him for loving and forgiving you, and ask Him to live in your heart. His promise to us is clear: "But as many as received Him, to them He gave the right to become children of God" (John 1:12).
5. **Confess your faith.** The Bible assures us: "If you confess with your mouth, 'Jesus is Lord,' and believe in your heart that God raised Him from the dead, you will be saved" (Rom. 10:9). You have been born again and are now part of God's family. Tell some one else what Jesus has done in your life!

Heavenly Father, I now understand my need to have my sins forgiven. I also realize that only Jesus — because of His sacrifice on the cross — can forgive my sin. I put my faith and trust in Jesus today. Please forgive me and become the Lord of my life.

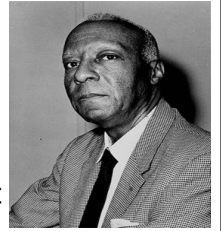

Celebrate Black History Month

A. Philip Randolph (1889-1979) — A singular figure in American history, Randolph's influence on labor and civil rights movements traversed presidential administrations and historical eras. A humanist, socialist, an influential mentor to activists like Bayard Rustin, Randolph built the Brotherhood of Sleeping Car Porters into the first predominantly African American labor union, successfully demanded the desegregation of the U.S. armed forces and originated the idea for a "march on Washington" by the civil rights group.



Mary McLeod Bethune (1875-1955) — The daughter of a slave, Bethune became one of the most important Black educators and activists in the 20th century. As the founder of a training school that served African American women and later became Bethune-Cookman College, Bethune was influenced by her Christian background and the teachings of Gandhi to advocate for a civil rights agenda inclusive of a broad range of religious and worldview traditions. "Any idea that keeps anybody out is too small for this age—open your heart and let everybody in," she advised her students.

Bayard Rustin (1912-1987) — Rustin dedicated his life to political and social change in America and his roots as a Quaker informed his quest for revolutionary change achieved through powerful, but peaceful, means. His organizing ability influenced freedom rides in the South, the Montgomery bus boycott and, perhaps his most notable achievement, the 1963 March on Washington. Throughout his life and work, Rustin sought diverse coalitions sharing common values, even across differing worldviews.



Howard Thurman (1899-1981) — Through his work as the dean of Howard University's Chapel and in founding interracial and interfaith churches in the 1940s, Thurman influenced a generation of civil rights-era leaders, including a young Martin Luther King, Jr. Thurman's travels in Southeast Asia exposed him to Gandhi and other influential religious figures. Back in the United States, his ministries focused on [bringing people of different faiths, races and classes together](#).
