THE COLOR OF FIRE REPRESENTS THE HOLY SPIRIT.

Pentecost, the fiftieth day after Easter, comes from the Greek word for fiftieth, *pentekoste*. Greek-speaking Jews called the Jewish Feast of Weeks the Day of Pentecost. Acts 2 tells how the anxious and fearful disciples, who had gathered on the Day of Pentecost, were filled with the Holy Spirit and thereafter preached boldly the gospel of Jesus Christ. This is the day on which the church received the Holy Spirit.

Theme For This Quarter:

"CONFIDENT HOPE"

The study this quarter looks at God's gift of faith as the source of hope. Sessions from the Gospels illuminate hope and faith in teachings and miracles of Jesus. Sessions from the Epistles show how the early church understood God's gift of salvation through faith in Christ as the source of hope.

UNIT 2 * "FAITH AND SALVTION"

This unit has four sessions. They explore in Paul's Letter to the Romans his understanding of the hope of salvation through faith. The letter teaches that God's righteousness is revealed in those who live by faith. Paul illustrates faith through the example of Abraham. He unpacks the teaching about being reconciled to God by justification through faith and teaches that salvation is for all.

HOW TO ACCEPT JESUS CHRIST INTO YOUR HEART

Perhaps while reading the announcements you realized you have never made a Christian commitment. Don't delay that decision! We encourage you to embrace God's love today and receive the salvation that only Jesus Christ gives. Here are five simple steps you can take to find assurance of salvation

- Recognize your need. The Bible tell us that "all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God." (Rom. 3:23) All of us are sinners, and we must admit our need for a Savior.
- Repent of your sins. Our sins create a wall that separates us from God. By confessing our sins and turning from them, you will find forgiveness. The Bible promises: "If we confess our sins, He is faithful and righteous to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness" (1 John 1:9).
- 3. **Believe in Jesus.** God sent His only Son to die so that He could pay for all our sins. Put your faith in Him and believe in His power to save you. The Bible says, "For God so loved the world, that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him shall not perish, but have eternal life" (John 3:16).
- 4. Receive His salvation. God has given us a great gift in His Son, but we must receive His gift. Thank Him for loving and forgiving you, and ask Him to live in your heart. His promise to us is clear: "But as many as received Him, to them He gave the right to become children of God" (John 1:12).
- 5. Confess your faith. The Bible assures us: "If you confess with your mouth, 'Jesus is Lord,' and believe in your heart that God raised Him from the dead, you will be saved" (Rom. 10:9). You have been born again and are now part of God's family. Tell some one else what Jesus has done in your life!

Heavenly Father, I now understand my need to have my sins forgiven. I also realize that only Jesus — because of His sacrifice on the cross — can forgive my sin. I put my faith and trust in Jesus today. Please forgive me and become the Lord of my life.

July Health Segment





Atrial Fibrillation which is often called (AFib or AF) is the most common type of abnormal heartbeat. With Atrial Fibrillation, it causes the heart to quiver, contracting in a very fast (often more than 300 beats per minute and in an irregular way). It causes the lower chamber to beat more rapidly than normal. This can be a dangerous condition because it can increase the risk of a stroke. A normal resting heart rate for adults is 60 to 100 beats per minute.

Did you Know?

People with AFib have a 5 times greater risk of having a stroke.

Statistics

In 2019, approximately 8 million people in the U.S. were projected to be affected by AFib. The number is expected to increase to 12 million by 2030. The prevalence is higher in people aged 65 and older.

Risk Factors

High blood pressure, advancing age, diabetes, sleep apnea, heavy alcohol use, heart disease, such as congestive heart failure, coronary artery disease and prior heart attacks.

Signs/Symptoms

Some people living with AFib have no symptoms. Those who do show signs may experience symptoms such as an irregular heartbeat, heart palpitations (rapid, fluttering or pounding), chest pain, light headedness, shortness of breath and fatigue.

Prevention

You can help avoid developing AFib by not smoking, follow a heart healthy Mediterranean Style diet (high plant-based foods), eating fruits and vegetables, decreasing foods in saturated fats, be physically active, and keep a normal weight indicated on a Body Mass Chart. Your doctor can be an important partner in helping you set and reach goals for a healthy heart.
