The color **GREEN** symbolizes growth. **KINGDOMTIDE** runs from August 26th until Advent. **KINGDOMTIDE** is the newest of the seasons, dating no farther back than the late 1930's. **KINGDOMTIDE** gives place for due attention to the eternal presence of Christ and His Kingship — with the parallel emphasis upon our stewardship. Its emphasis on the kingship of Christ and His kingdom, challenges us in our daily lives and in every area of our existence.



Theme For This Quarter:

"LOVE FOR ONE ANOTHER"

God commands us to love one another as God loves us. This quarter begins with a widely known story about Joseph, which deals with love within Jacob's family. These lessons elaborate on themes of love for one another in the epistles of Paul and James and the expressions of love in the early formations of the church in Acts.

UNIT 2 — INCLUSIVE LOVE

This unit has four lessons. The focus of the lessons is on love for the stranger, the poor, and enemies as well as divine love reflected in human life. First Samuel shows David's love for others. Luke explores the teachings of Jesus regarding love for one's enemies and Jesus' parable of the good Samaritan. First Corinthians explores the sermon on love from Paul's writing, which depicts the height of human love coming from divine love.

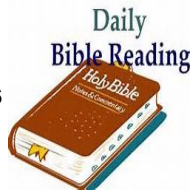

HOW TO ACCEPT JESUS CHRIST INTO YOUR HEART

Perhaps while reading the announcements you realized you have never made a Christian commitment. Don't delay that decision! We encourage you to embrace God's love today and receive the salvation that only Jesus Christ gives. Here are five simple steps you can take to find assurance of salvation.

1. **Recognize your need.** The Bible tells us that "all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God." (Rom. 3:23) All of us are sinners, and we must admit our need for a Savior.
2. **Repent of your sins.** Our sins create a wall that separates us from God. By confessing our sins and turning from them, you will find forgiveness. The Bible promises: "If we confess our sins, He is faithful and righteous to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness" (1 John 1:9).
3. **Believe in Jesus.** God sent His only Son to die so that He could pay for all our sins. Put your faith in Him and believe in His power to save you. The Bible says, "For God so loved the world, that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him shall not perish, but have eternal life" (John 3:16).
4. **Receive His salvation.** God has given us a great gift in His Son, but we must receive His gift. Thank Him for loving and forgiving you, and ask Him to live in your heart. His promise to us is clear: "But as many as received Him, to them He gave the right to become children of God" (John 1:12).
5. **Confess your faith.** The Bible assures us: "If you confess with your mouth, 'Jesus is Lord,' and believe in your heart that God raised Him from the dead, you will be saved" (Rom. 10:9). You have been born again and are now part of God's family. Tell someone else what Jesus has done in your life!

Heavenly Father, I now understand my need to have my sins forgiven. I also realize that only Jesus — because of His sacrifice on the cross — can forgive my sin. I put my faith and trust in Jesus today. Please forgive me and become the Lord of my life.

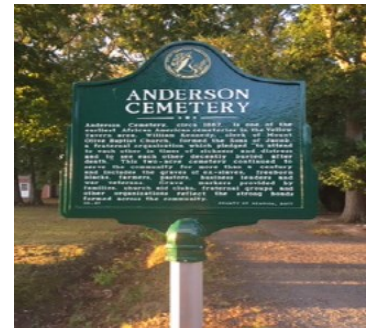

2020 ELECTION



To remain a qualified registered voter, the law requires you to notify your local registration office of any change in your name or address. This must be done before the registration books close for the next election. **The deadline to register to vote, or update an existing registration for the upcoming election is Tuesday, October 13, 2020, 5:00 PM.**

Absentee Voting for the General Election has begun and ends on October 31, 2020.

Ways to Vote: There are three options available for voting. They are:

1. **Vote by Mail:** Your ballot must be postmarked on or before November 3rd and received by noon on Friday, November 6th.
2. **In Person before Election Day:**
You can vote at your local Voter Registration Office or satellite voting location by October 31st. **Or**
3. **In person on Election Day November 3rd:**
Polls open at 6:00 AM until 7:00 PM. As long as you are standing on line by 7:00 PM you will be able to vote.



What is Breast Cancer?

Breast Cancer is a disease in which malignant (cancer) cells form in the tissues of the breast.

Did You Know These Facts About Breast Cancer?

- 1 in 8 women in the US will be diagnosed with breast cancer in her lifetime.
- Breast cancer is the most commonly diagnosed cancer in women.
- Breast cancer is the second leading cause of cancer death among women.
- Although breast cancer in men is rare, an estimated 2,470 men will be diagnosed with breast cancer and approximately 460 will die each year
- Over 3.3 million breast cancer survivors are alive in the United States today

Signs/Symptoms

- Lump in the breast
- Breast/nipple tenderness
- Thickening of an area of the breast or around the nipple
- Dimpling anywhere of the breast
- Nipple discharge
- Asymmetry of the breast
- Inverted nipple

Diagnosis

Breast cancer can be diagnosed through multiple tests, including a mammogram, ultrasound, MRI, and biopsy.

Prevention

When breast cancer is detected early and is in the localized stage, the five-year survival rate is 100%. Early detection includes doing monthly breast self-exams, scheduling regular clinical breast exams, and mammograms.

Awareness of the symptoms and the need for screening are important ways of reducing the risk. Many breast lumps are not cancerous, but any woman who is concerned about a lump or change of their breasts, should see a doctor.
