The color **GREEN** symbolizes growth. **KINGDOMTIDE** runs from August 26th until Advent. **KINGDOMTIDE** is the newest of the seasons, dating no farther back than the late 1930's. **KINGDOMTIDE** gives place for due attention to the eternal presence of Christ and His Kingship — with the parallel emphasis upon our stewardship. Its emphasis on the kingship of Christ and His kingdom, challenges us in our daily lives and in every area of our existence.



Theme For This Quarter:

"LOVE FOR ONE ANOTHER"

God commands us to love one another as God loves us. This quarter begins with a widely known story about Joseph, which deals with love within Jacob's family. These lessons elaborate on themes of love for one another in the epistles of Paul and James and the expressions of love in the early formations of the church in Acts.

UNIT 1 — STRUGGLES WITH LOVE

This unit has four lessons. The lessons reveal aspects of love. Lesson 1 reveals how a lack of familial love devolves into jealousy and destruction. Lesson 2 portrays Joseph's commitment to love that refuses to hold on to past wrongs but rather seeks God's path to future success. Lessons 3 and 4 show Joseph's brother coming to Egypt and reveal how love and reconciliation can prevail in spite of harsh and negative circumstances.

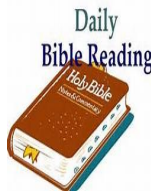

HOW TO ACCEPT JESUS CHRIST INTO YOUR HEART

Perhaps while reading the announcements you realized you have never made a Christian commitment. Don't delay that decision! We encourage you to embrace God's love today and receive the salvation that only Jesus Christ gives. Here are five simple steps you can take to find assurance of salvation.

1. **Recognize your need.** The Bible tells us that "all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God." (Rom. 3:23) All of us are sinners, and we must admit our need for a Savior.
2. **Repent of your sins.** Our sins create a wall that separates us from God. By confessing our sins and turning from them, you will find forgiveness. The Bible promises: "If we confess our sins, He is faithful and righteous to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness" (1 John 1:9).
3. **Believe in Jesus.** God sent His only Son to die so that He could pay for all our sins. Put your faith in Him and believe in His power to save you. The Bible says, "For God so loved the world, that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him shall not perish, but have eternal life" (John 3:16).
4. **Receive His salvation.** God has given us a great gift in His Son, but we must receive His gift. Thank Him for loving and forgiving you, and ask Him to live in your heart. His promise to us is clear: "But as many as received Him, to them He gave the right to become children of God" (John 1:12).
5. **Confess your faith.** The Bible assures us: "If you confess with your mouth, 'Jesus is Lord,' and believe in your heart that God raised Him from the dead, you will be saved" (Rom. 10:9). You have been born again and are now part of God's family. Tell someone else what Jesus has done in your life!

Heavenly Father, I now understand my need to have my sins forgiven. I also realize that only Jesus — because of His sacrifice on the cross — can forgive my sin. I put my faith and trust in Jesus today. Please forgive me and become the Lord of my life.

The General Election is steadfastly approaching. Viewing your registration status and voter information has gotten easier with the Virginia Department of Elections' citizen portal. You may review your information at www.elections.virginia.gov. You will need to click on "Registration". Then click on "View your info". You may also contact your locality's Voter Registration Office to check on your voting status.

UPDATING YOUR NAME OR ADDRESS

The deadline to register to vote, or update an existing registration for the upcoming election is Tuesday, October 13, 2020, 5:00 PM. If you want to make a change to your address, name or other information, you may do so by:

Using the online registration portal (see website information above) By **completing** the Virginia Voter Registration Application

Or

Sending a letter to your General Registrar

Letters should be addressed to the Voter Registration Office for the **City** or **County** in which you live. Letters should include the following information:

1. Name
2. Enough information to identify you – such as the Social Security Number
3. Current address
4. Previous address
5. Signature

September is National Sickle Cell Disease Awareness Month



What is Sickle Cell Anemia?

Sickle cell anemia is a condition in which there aren't enough healthy red blood cells to carry enough oxygen to the rest of the body. Sickle cell anemia is an inherited disease in which both parents are carriers of the sickle cell trait.

In sickle cell anemia, the red blood cells which are normally round and are able to pass through blood vessels easily take on a moon or crescent shape. This shape becomes more easily stuck when travelling through the blood vessels and thus, hinders blood flow and oxygen from getting to the rest of the body. This in turn causes pain.

Sickle Cell Facts

- 1 in 13 African-American babies are born with the Sickle Cell Trait
- Approximately 100,000 Americans are affected by Sickle Cell Disease

Signs/Symptoms

- Low red blood cell count known as anemia
- Pain which may last from a few hours to a few weeks
- Painful swelling of hands and feet
- Frequent infections
- Delayed growth
- Vision problems

Treatment

- There is no cure for sickle cell disease
- Due to low blood counts, many sickle cell patients require a blood transfusion. Donating blood to the Virginia Blood Bank is a wonderful way to help patients with sickle cell anemia

Prevention

If you are looking to start a family, you and your spouse should be tested for the sickle cell trait and discuss your results with a genetic counselor.

General Election 2020

Absentee Voting for the General Election will begin on September 18, 2020 and end on October 31, 2020. There are three options available for voting. They are:

1. Vote by Mail:

You must submit a "No Excuse Ballot" application. You may go to www.elections.virginia.gov to submit the application electronically, or you may contact your Registrar's Office to request that the application be mailed to you. The telephone number for Henrico County Registrar's Office is 804-503-4347.

Voters who will be voting by mail are strongly encouraged to request and submit your application as soon as possible. The actual ballot for voters requesting a ballot via mail will start to be sent out on September 18, 2020.

October, 23, 2020 - Deadline to request an absentee ballot to be mailed to you (this is the last day that ballots will be mailed out). Keep in mind when voting by mail you must allow time for the ballot to be mailed to you and for you to return the ballot by mail.

November 3, 2020- Your completed ballot must be postmarked by this date.

For information, you (**the actual voter**) can return your completed ballot to the Registrar's Office in person.

2. In Person Absentee Voting at your Registrar's Office.

September 18, 2020 – Absentee Voting begins. You may visit your Registrar's Office and vote in person during normal business hours. Henrico County business hours are 8:00am to 4:30pm, Monday through Friday. There will also be two Saturday dates available to voters for in person voting at your registrar's office. You will be advised when we get closer to the designated Saturdays dates. Voters who reside outside of Henrico County are encouraged to check with their locality regarding their business hours.

October 31, 2020 – Last day to vote Absentee in Person.

Or

3. Your polling location on November 3, 2020.

Polls open at 6:00am and close at 7:00pm. As long as you are standing on line by 7:00pm you will be able to vote.

Honors Intern and Collegiate Hire Job Openings Close September 30

The FBI has opened the annual application processes for the FY2021 Honors Internship Program and the Collegiate Hiring Initiative (CHI). These postings will close on September 30 and cover positions in all field offices and headquarters locations. Employees who know suitable candidates for these positions are asked to encourage them to apply at www.fbijobs.gov.

Honors Intern Program

The posting is open to undergraduate and graduate students who will graduate in fall 2021 or later; freshmen, however, are not eligible for the program. Selected interns will work side-by-side with FBI employees on case support, research projects, program management projects, and more. HRD expects to make conditional job offers in October and begin background investigations in November.

Collegiate Hiring Initiative Eligibility Requirements and Process

This week, HRD posted 14 separate job announcements for the 2021 CHI on www.fbijobs.gov; candidate lists from these announcements will be valid for a year. In the application, a candidate can select up to 10 locations for which they want to be considered. To be eligible, a candidate must:

Have graduated or will graduate between May 2019 and June 2021. Veterans graduation dates are from May 2015 to June 2021.

Have a graduating GPA of 2.95 on a 4.0 scale or higher.

Be able to obtain a top-secret security clearance.

Not be a current, permanent FBI employee.

Attach transcript(s) and/or appropriate documents by the close of the job posting.
