Perhaps while reading the announcements you realized you have never made a Christian commitment. Don't delay that decision! We encourage you to embrace God's love today and receive the salvation that only Jesus Christ gives. Here are five simple steps you can take to find assurance of salvation.

- Recognize your need. The Bible tell us that "all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God." (Rom. 3:23) All of us are sinners, and we must admit our need for a Savior.
- Repent of your sins. Our sins create a wall that separates us from God. By confessing our sins and turning from them, you will find forgiveness. The Bible promises: "If we confess our sins, He is faithful and righteous to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness" (1 John 1:9).
- 3. **Believe in Jesus.** God sent His only Son to die so that He could pay for all our sins. Put your faith in Him and believe in His power to save you. The Bible says, "For God so loved the world, that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him shall not perish, but have eternal life" (John 3:16).
- 4. Receive His salvation. God has given us a great gift in His Son, but we must receive His gift. Thank Him for loving and forgiving you, and ask Him to live in your heart. His promise to us is clear: "But as many as received Him, to them He gave the right to become children of God" (John 1:12).

Virginia Phase Two Reopening

Phase Two reopening rules took effect on June 12. An end date for Phase Two has not yet been announced. That decision will be made at the state level by Virginia's elected officials and public health experts.

Why are we moving to Phase Two?

Since restrictions were first put in place in March, Commonwealth officials and public health experts have been monitoring metrics like testing availability, personal protective equipment supply, hospital bed capacity, percentage of positive tests, and hospitalizations. State officials have seen improvement in those metrics in recent weeks, indicating that it's now safe for most Virginians to begin Phase Two.

Here are some of the changes that will go into effect under Phase Two:

- Restaurants can have indoor seating at 50 percent capacity
- Gyms can have indoor classes and workouts at 30 percent capacity
- Pools can open with restrictions
- Entertainment venues like museums and zoos can open with restrictions
- Recreational sports will be allowed but there can be no shared equipment
- Gatherings will be limited to 50 people rather than 10

Officials recommend citizens continue to wear face masks, stand six feet apart from people in public, avoid social gatherings and continue to frequently sanitize their hands.

Religious Services

Open with occupancy limited to 50% of the max. Attendees who are not members of the same household must remain six feet apart, and may not pass items between groups. Any containers used to distribute food or beverages must be single-use and discarded.

Frequently touched surfaces must be thoroughly cleaned prior to and following each service.

Our success in this phase will depend on everyone becoming familiar with the guidelines for how we can live, work, and play safely at this point, and sharing what they learn with their family, friends, and coworkers.

There are two ballots for the Primary Election (**Democratic and Republican**). You may only cast one ballot.

Primary Elections determine who will be on the ballot in the November (General Election). Listed below is a synopsis of the two ballots. **The House of Representative information provided is for Henrico County voters**. The Republican Ballot is for the United States Senate which is for the entire state of Virginia.

Democratic Ballot: House of Representative (4th Congressional District). The current Representative for the 4th District is Senator Donald McEachin. There is one other Democratic candidate opposing Senator McEachin.

For information, House of Representative Abigail Spanberger (Democrat) (7th District) is unopposed.

Republican Ballot – United States Senate (State-Wide Election) Senator Mark R. Warner (Democrat), our current senator, is unopposed. You will only be voting in the Primary Election for the Republican candidate to run against Senator Warner in November.
