The Bible tell us that "all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God." (Rom. 3:23) All of us are sinners, and we must admit our need for a Savior. Repent of your sins. The Bible promises: "If we confess our sins, He is faithful and righteous to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness" (1 John 1:9). Believe in Jesus. God sent His only Son to die so that He could pay for all our sins. Put your faith in Him and believe in His power to save you. The Bible says, "For God so loved the world, that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him shall not perish, but have eternal life" (John 3:16). Receive His salvation. God has given us a great gift in His Son, but we must receive His gift. Thank Him for loving and forgiving you, and ask Him to live in your heart. His promise to us is clear: "But as many as received Him, to them He gave the right to become children of God" (John 1:12). Confess your faith. The Bible assures us: "If you confess with your mouth, 'Jesus is Lord,' and believe in your heart that God raised Him from the dead, you will be saved" (Rom. 10:9). You have been born again and are now part of God's family. Tell some one else what Jesus has done in your life! Heavenly Father, I now understand my need to have my sins forgiven. I also realize that only Jesus — because of His sacrifice on the cross — can forgive my sin. I put my faith and trust in Jesus today. Please forgive me and become the Lord of my life.



2020 PRESIDENTIAL PRIMARY ELECTION


VOTER INFORMATION

The Democratic Presidential Primary will be held on March 3, 2020. Absentee voting for this primary begins on January 16, 2020. Absentee voting involves voting in person at your voter registration office. You may also complete an application and have your ballot mailed to you.

For those who wish to vote on March 3rd, February 10, 2020, is the last day you may register to vote or update your existing voting application.

Young People – Anyone who will be eighteen by November 3, 2020, can register to vote now and will be eligible to vote in the Democratic Presidential Primary on March 3^{rd} . You must complete your application by February 10^{th} .



What is Cervical Cancer?

Cervical cancer is a type of cancer that occurs in the cells of the cervix — the lower part of the uterus that connects to the vagina. You can reduce your risk of developing cervical cancer by having screening tests and receiving a vaccine that protects against Human Papillomavirus (HPV) infection.

Risk Factors

- **Many sexual partners.** The greater your number of sexual partners the greater your chance of acquiring HPV.
- Early sexual activity
- Other sexually transmitted infections (STIs). Having other STIs such as chlamydia, gonorrhea, syphilis and HIV/AIDS increases your risk of HPV.
- A weak immune system
- **Smoking.** Smoking is associated with squamous cell cervical cancer.

Symptoms

Early-stage cervical cancer generally produces no signs or symptoms. Signs and symptoms of more-advanced cervical cancer include:

- Vaginal bleeding after intercourse, between periods or after menopause
- Watery, bloody vaginal discharge that may be heavy and have a foul odor
- Pelvic pain or pain during intercourse

Prevention

To reduce your risk of cervical cancer:

- **Get vaccinated against HPV.** Vaccination is available for girls and women ages 9 to 26. The vaccine is most effective if given to girls before they become sexually active.
- Have routine Pap tests. Pap tests can detect precancerous conditions of the cervix, so they can be monitored or treated to prevent cervical cancer. Most medical organizations suggest women begin routine Pap tests at age 21 and repeat them every few years.
- **Practice Abstinence/Safe sex.** Delaying intercourse, using a condom, and having fewer sexual partners may reduce your risk of cervical cancer.
- Don't smoke
